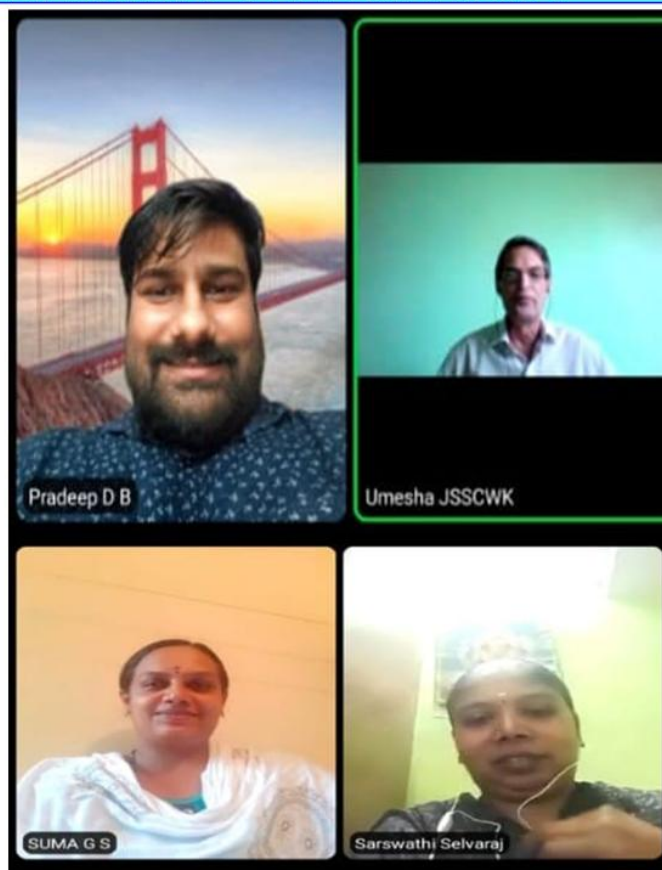

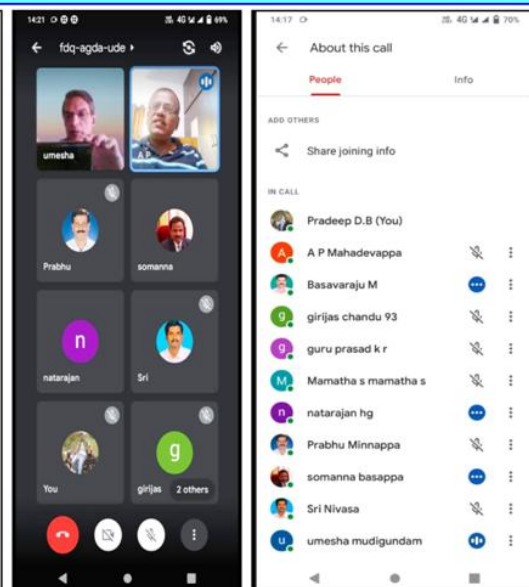

Principal Prof Umesha chaired the meeting, All heads, Librarian and computer programmer were present in the meeting.

Education for all is one of the major tasks being carried out by the government of India but still we have the lowest female literacy rate.

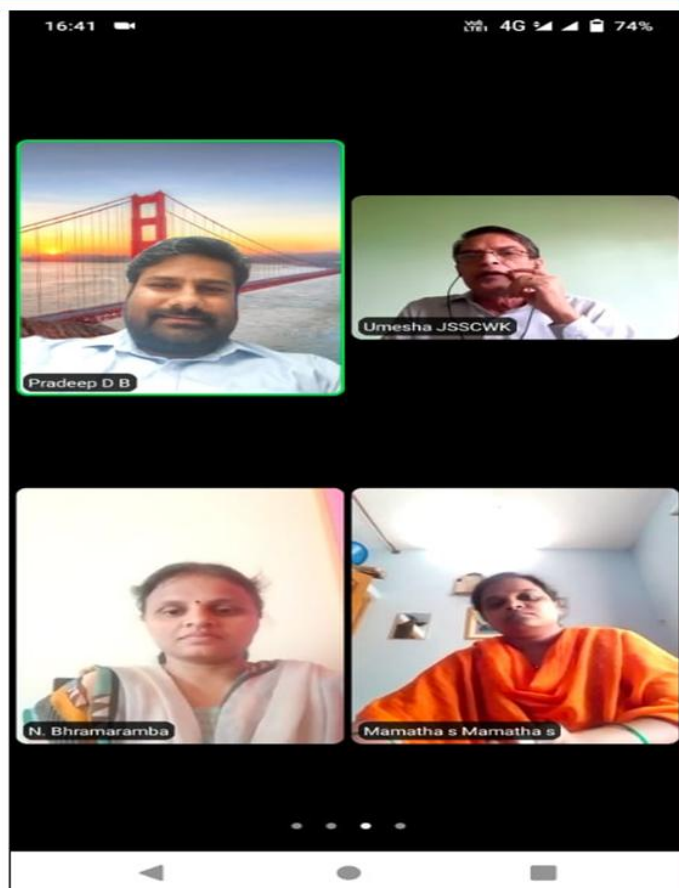

We must be aware of the fact that if women are uneducated the close to half of population is uneducated. Educating a woman means educating the family and the Nation.

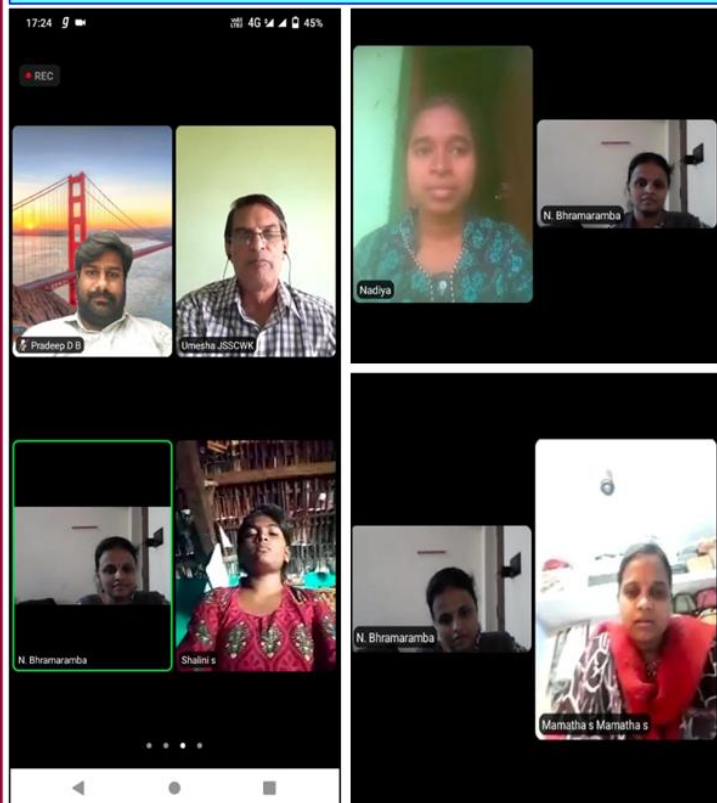
India's gross enrollment ratio of pupil going into higher education is only around at 30%. State government management is also very much interested in increasing particularly women education.

Smt Bhramaramba concluded the programme by rendering vote of thanks.

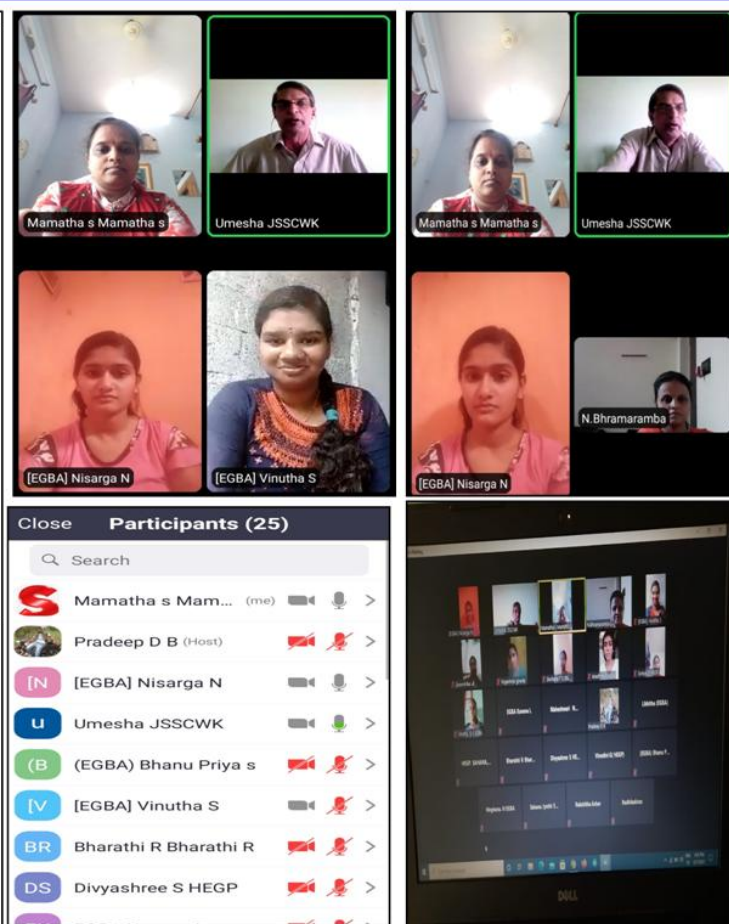
ONLINE OUTREACH AND EXTENSION ACTIVITY

Smt Mamtha welcomed, Smt Bhramaramba proposed vote of thanks.



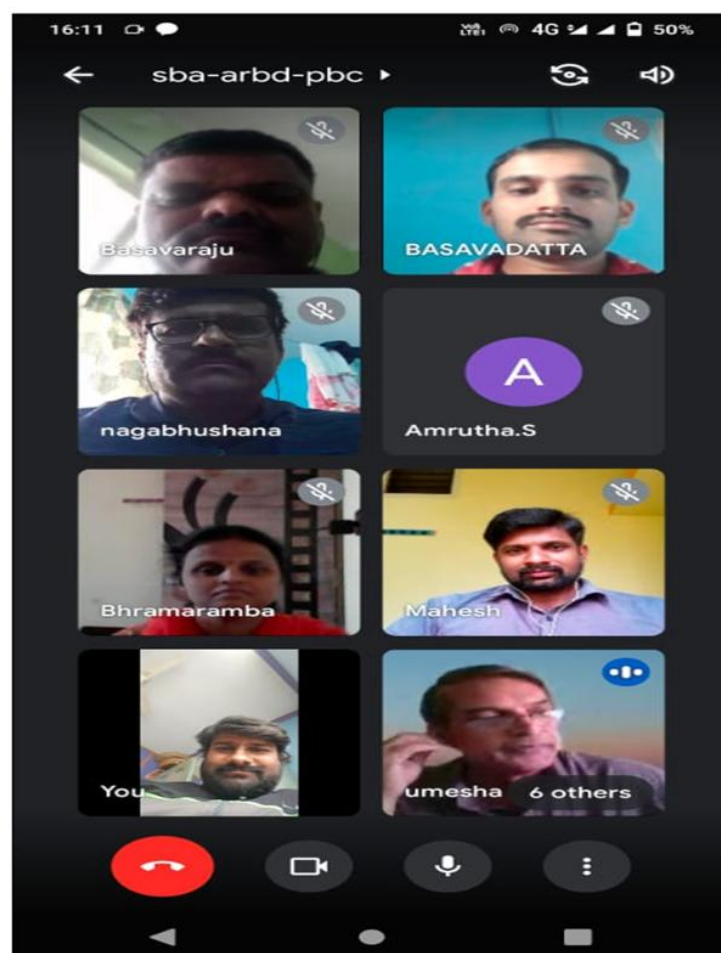
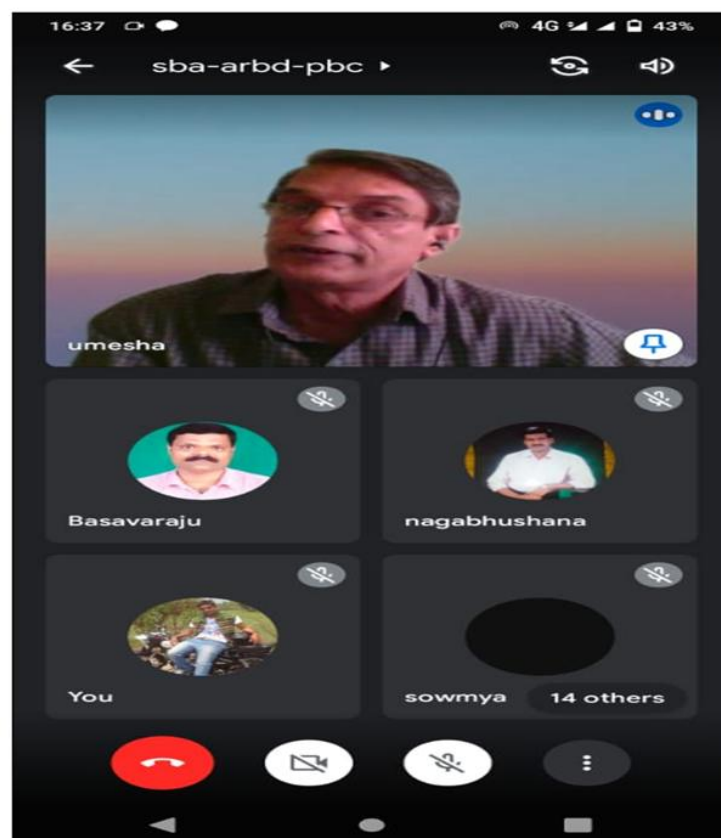
STAFF MEETING

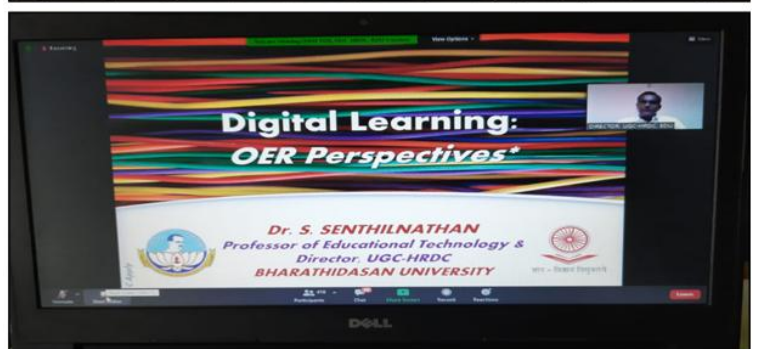
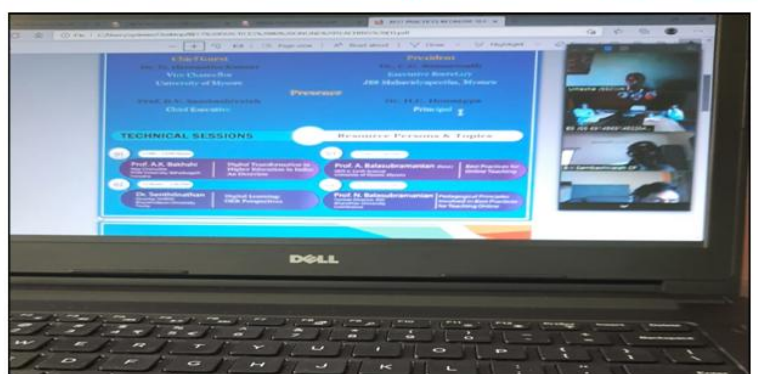
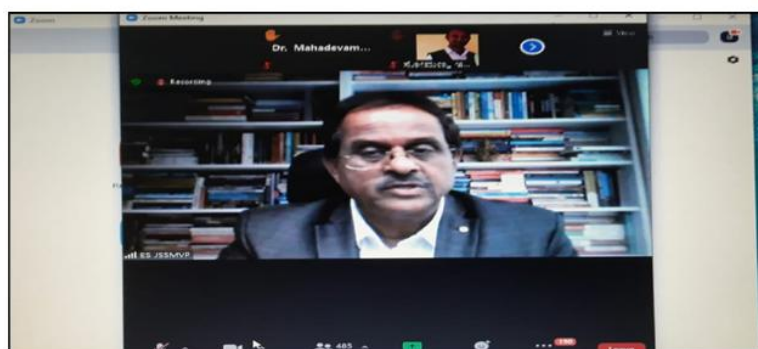
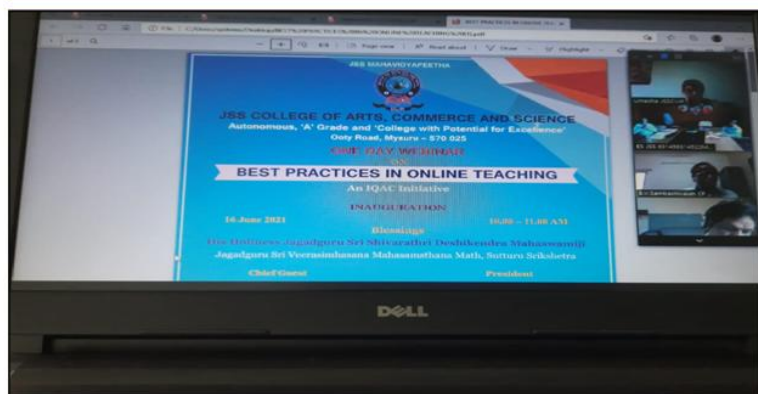
Meeting was chaired by Prof Umesha Principal and all teachers were present except Dr .M Prabhu and Smt Suma who took absence of leave.

TEACHERS PARTICIPATION IN WEBINAR

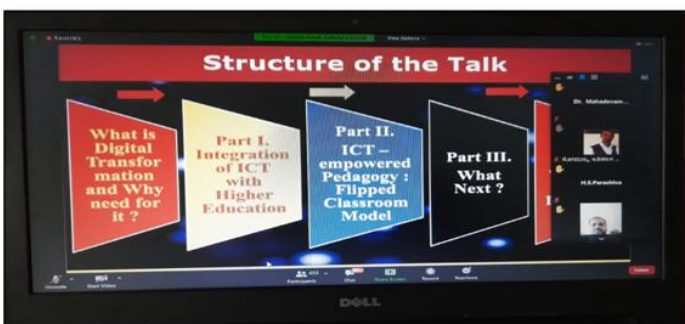

All teaching fraternity of the college participated in the webinar.



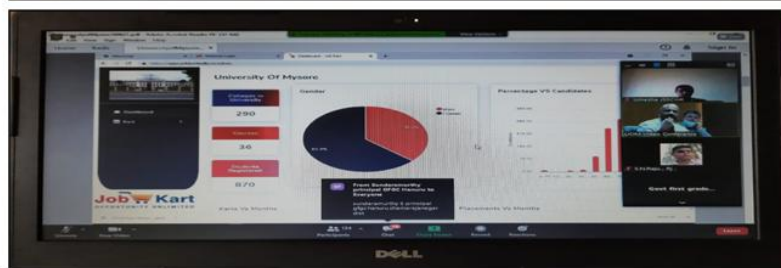
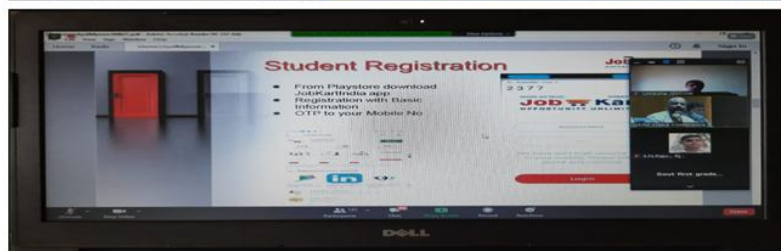
PRINCIPAL'S PARTICIPATION IN PRINCIPALS MEETING

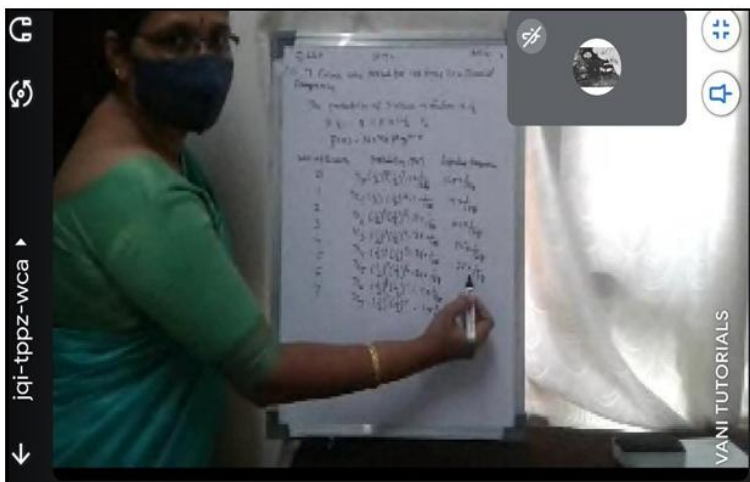
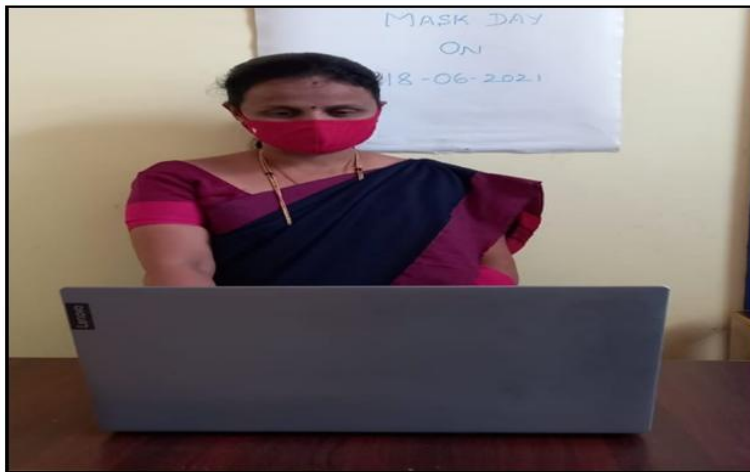
Yoga is a physical, mental and spiritual practice the originated in India and helps people lead a healthier lifestyle.

VII INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY

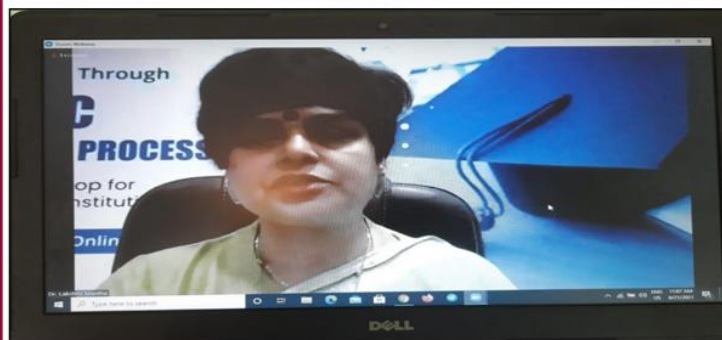

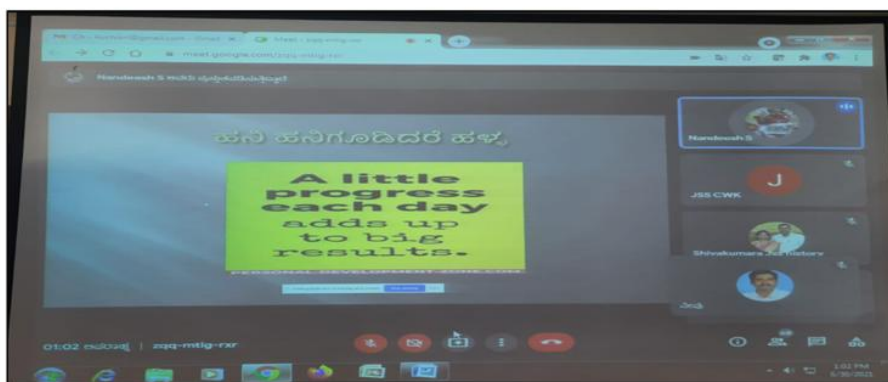
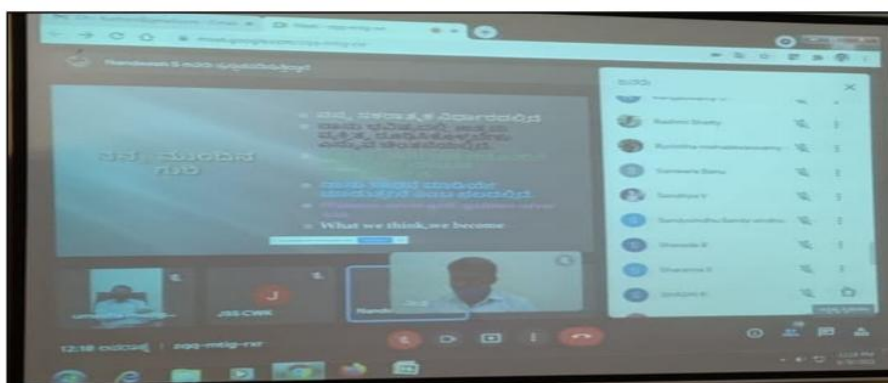
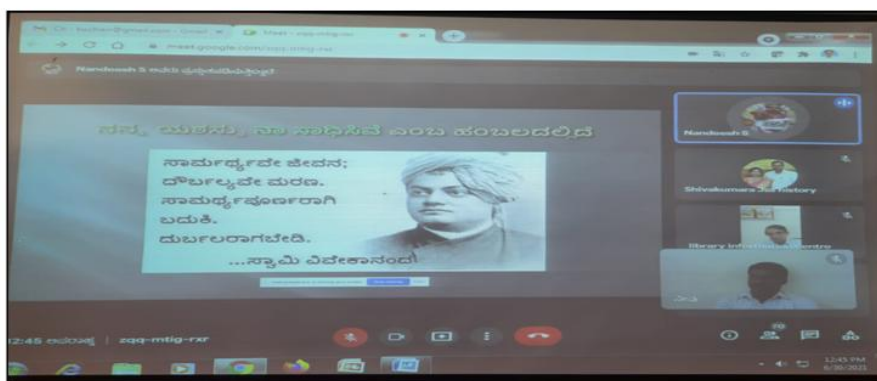
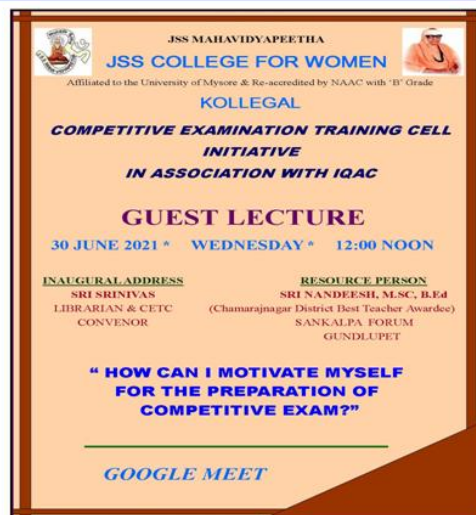
HOW CAN I MOTIVATE MYSELF FOR THE PREPARATION OF COMPETITIVE EXAM?
